RE: ONE CONFIRMED CASE OF COVID-19 AT LO-ELLEN PARK SECONDARY SCHOOL

Public Health Sudbury & Districts has advised Rainbow District School Board that **ONE** confirmed case of COVID-19 has been reported at Lo-Ellen Park Secondary School.

The individual is currently self-isolating and being monitored by Public Health Sudbury & Districts. There is no evidence of transmission of COVID-19 at the school at this time.

Lo-Ellen Park Secondary School remains open for in-person learners.

We are implementing enhanced cleaning and disinfecting before school resumes.

The following class has been asked to self-isolate to and including March 9, 2021:

Grade 8 B Class

The affected students, their parents/guardians and relevant staff have been notified and have received a letter from Public Health with specific guidance. Public Health will directly contact all parents/guardians of students and all school personnel who have been identified as **close contacts**.

Lo-Ellen Park students on the afternoon secondary run on bus Route L809 and the afternoon secondary run on bus Route L881 are also required to self-isolate to and including March 9, 2021. The affected students, their parents/guardians and relevant bus drivers have been notified and have received a letter from Public Health with specific guidance. Public Health will directly contact all parents/guardians of students who have been identified as **close contacts**.

IMPORTANT: A second possible case **tested negative** and has no impact on the school.

Students in the following classes and related staff, who were sent home in an abundance of caution pending test results, are NOT required to self-isolate and can return to school on Monday:

Grade 10 Canadian History CHC 2DI-01

Multi-Grades Physical Education PPL 2OI-02 / PPL 2OX-02 / PPL 3OI-02

For students and staff who have not been asked to self-isolate as part of the confirmed case that affects Grade 8 B only, the following continues to apply:

- Simply passing by an infected person in the hallway is not considered close contact, and the risk of spreading the virus this way is extremely low.

• Remember to screen for COVID-19 daily. Continue to use the **COVID-19 Screening Tool for Children in School and Child Care** <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/> to monitor for symptoms and follow the direction provided. **Anyone who is sick must stay home. Please note that there are UPDATED isolation requirements. Students are required to confirm they have completed the screen in first period attendance.**

Remember to follow the critical ongoing COVID-19 prevention measures:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Sneeze and cough into your sleeve.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Stay home and [isolate](#) if symptoms appear.
- Practise two-metre physical distancing.
- Wear a mask in indoor public spaces and outdoors, especially when physical distancing of two meters cannot be maintained.

We continue to work closely with Public Health as we implement ongoing health and safety protocols to limit the spread of COVID-19.

As always, we will monitor our school population closely for any signs of COVID-19, remain vigilant, and follow the guidance from Public Health.

Public Health continues to investigate the situation and if any risks to the school community are identified, they may direct additional measures.
