Today at 4:14 pm, Public Health Sudbury & Districts declared the outbreak at Carl A. Nesbitt Public School officially over.

On behalf of the school and the board, I would like to thank you for following Public Health guidance on self-isolation and testing. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work together to keep everyone safe.

Please continue to follow all health and safety protocols at all times.

• Remember to screen for COVID-19 daily. Continue to use the **COVID-19 Screening Tool for Children in School and Child Care** <u>https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/</u> to monitor for symptoms and follow the direction provided. **Anyone who is sick must stay home.**

Remember to follow the critical ongoing COVID-19 prevention measures:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- · Sneeze and cough into your sleeve.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Stay home and isolate if symptoms appear.
- Practise two-metre physical distancing.
- Wear a mask at all times in indoor public spaces.

When outdoors, students are encouraged to maintain physical distancing.
