RE: TWO CONFIRMED CASES OF COVID-19 AT LITTLE CURRENT PUBLIC SCHOOL

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Public Health Sudbury & Districts has advised Rainbow District School Board that two confirmed cases of COVID-19 have been reported at Little Current Public School.

The individuals are currently self-isolating and being monitored by Public Health Sudbury & Districts. The school is being cleaned and disinfected today.

There is no evidence of transmission at the school at this time.

Little Current Public School remains open for in-person learning.

The school will follow up with affected students to ensure continuity of learning.

By direction of Public Health, the Grade 3 class in Room 102 and the Grade 4 class in Room 207 are required to self-isolate to and including November 18, 2021. In addition, the isolation period for the Grade 6/7 class in Room 206, which was dismissed yesterday, has been extended up to and including November 19, 2021. The affected students, their parents/guardians and relevant staff have been notified and have received a letter from Public Health with specific guidance. **Direction for staff as well as the Grade 6/7 class is based on immunization status.**

By direction of Public Health, the requirement for students on the morning and afternoon elementary bus run on Route A969 to be tested and to self-isolate to and including November 18, 2021 and the requirement for students on the morning and afternoon elementary bus runs on Route A971 to be tested and to self-isolate up to and including November 19, 2021 is based on immunization status. The affected students, their parents/guardians and relevant bus drivers have been notified and have received a letter from Public Health with specific guidance. **These bus runs are cancelled. Route A969 will resume on Friday, November 19, 2021. Route A971 will resume on Monday, November 22, 2021.**

For students and staff who have not been asked to self-isolate as part of this confirmed case, the following applies:

- Simply passing by an infected person in the hallway is not considered close contact, and the risk of spreading the virus this way is extremely low.

• Remember to screen for COVID-19 daily. Continue to use the **COVID-19 Screening Tool for Children in School and Child Care** <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/> to monitor for symptoms and follow the direction provided. **Anyone who is sick must stay home.**

Remember to follow the critical ongoing COVID-19 prevention measures:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Sneeze and cough into your sleeve.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Stay home and [isolate](#) if symptoms appear.
- Practise two-metre physical distancing.
- **Wear a mask** at all times in indoor public spaces.
- When outdoors, students are encouraged to maintain physical distancing.

We continue to work closely with Public Health as we implement ongoing health and safety protocols to limit the spread of COVID-19.

We will monitor our school population closely for any signs of COVID-19 and follow the guidance from Public Health.

Public Health continues to investigate the situation and if any risks to the school community are identified, they may direct additional measures.
