This week we have provided you with a set of "dot cards" from 0 to 10 and instructions for a game known as Ten Frame Fish.

This game is designed to build on the "subitizing" activity from last week.

Ten Fish Frame

What you'll need:

> Two sets of ten frame dot cards

How to play:

- > Play in groups of 2 to 3.
- Deal each player 4 cards.
- > Spread the rest in the center (face down) like a fishpond.
- > Players look through their cards, remove any matching pairs and place them face down in front of them.
- ➤ Players then take turns asking any of the other players, for cards that will match a card in their hand. "Do you have a _____?"
- If that player has the card, it is handed over to the player whose turn it is.
- ➤ If the player that is asked does not have the card, he responds, "Go fish" and the player whose turn it is, picks a card from the fish pond.
- ➤ Play continues until one player has matched all of their cards. The winner is the player with the most matching pairs.

Variation:

For children who are still developing number concepts to five, you may play using only the 0 to 5 number cards.
