SKILLS FOR THE FUTURE

A Homework Program for GRADE 1 Students

- * As parents, you are your child's most influential teacher and they need a positive, supportive environment in order to be willing to take on new challenges. These fun activities can be done at home to reinforce the learning taking place throughout the day at school.
- * Find 30 minutes in your day and pick a few activities that your child will enjoy doing. Keep in mind that these are skills that are expected to be mastered by the end of Grade 1, so you may want to take baby steps as you try new activities.

Operational Math - How Can You Help at Home?

- **Count** different items around the house or yard, with a goal of reaching **50** by the end of the school year (ex. count laundry as it is coming out of the dryer, count pasta, pine cones or cereal)
- Play **I SPY** with numbers around the house, focusing on numbers **1-10**. Look at a digital clock or remote control identify a number. Have your child write down the number as the word. (ex. 7 seven)
- Count your change! Take your coins out of your purse or piggy bank. Ask your child to tell you what each coin is and what it represents and then make change amounts up to **20 cents**.
- Add and subtract items around the house, with a goal of reaching a total sum of 10.
 (If there are 4 spoons on the table and we add 2 more spoons, how many will there be?)

Sight Words

- The Dolch word list for Grade 1 is a list of commonly used words that students have to know by sight for fast or 'fluent' reading. The complete list of Dolch words is included in our resource section. Each month you will be given a new group of words to focus on. Put these words on smaller pieces of paper and use them as flash cards. During September review the following:
- all, am, are, at, but, came, did, into, the, our, please, she, he, must, no, on, say, pretty, saw, that, there, they, this, too, under, want, was, well, went, what, who, will, with, yes, black, brown, white, eat, good, have, now, soon, ride, and, here, jump, make, said, where, come
