## **SKILLS FOR THE FUTURE**

A Homework Program for GRADE 6 Students

\* As parents, you are your child's most influential teacher and they need a positive, supportive environment in order to be willing to take on new challenges. These fun activities can be done at home to reinforce the learning taking place throughout the day at school.

\* Find 30 minutes in your day and pick a few activities that your child will enjoy doing. Keep in mind that these are skills that are expected to be mastered by the end of Grade 6, so you may want to take baby steps as you try new activities.

## MATH FLUENCY - How Can You Help at Home?

- Multiply to **10x10** and divide up to **100/10**. (Attached is a multiplication table for your use)
- Calculate tax on purchases using flyers or catalogues. (Bike \$74.99 plus tax. What would the total cost be?)
- Add and subtract decimal numbers.
- Use percentages to estimate quantities (Ex. My glass is 50% full.)

## EXTRA, EXTRA, Read All About It!



Using newspapers is a great way to improve reading, spelling and writing abilities as well as critical thinking skills. An added bonus of working with newspapers is they allow students the opportunity to examine daily coverage of national and local issues and they offer great conversation starters for a discussion around the table or in the car. **Cursive Writing** – Students are expected to use cursive writing at this stage. Attached are templates for each letter. Have your child cursive write a response to one of the articles they read in the newspaper, keep a cursive writing journal or write poetry or song lyrics.

**Keyboarding-** Today, efficient keyboard and computer operation is a necessary skill for the majority of occupations. Keyboarding is an expected tool for communication throughout one's life. It is considered as important a skill as being able to print and write well. There are many typing games available online that will allow your child to try and beat their words per minute each time. You can get them to type out some of their written work as well, using proper finger location on the keyboard.

## The Importance of Reading

By Grade 6, students are continuing in their 'reading to learn' journey and it is so important that we encourage reading in the home. Students are now expected to automatically read and understand most words, across a wide variety of reading contexts. Examples of reading materials could be cookbooks, comic books, instruction manuals, road signs, atlases and poetry. Print is literally everywhere!
