


Homework Calendar October 2017

Grades 4 to 6

Homework- 15 minutes per night. Please aim to work with your child 4 times a week. These homework activities can be adjusted to fit your schedule and can be complete on nights that work best for your family. You can challenge or support your child by adjusting the tasks as needed.

Homework Week of October 2 - 6	Reading	Read for 20 minutes each night. Go to the library together and explore the titles available. Try a new genre, graphic novel, etc.

	Keyboarding	Keyboarding will help your child communicate throughout his/her life. There are many typing games available. Here is a link to some online games: http://www.learninggamesforkids.com
	Math	Card Game - Number Battle (War) to be played with a deck of playing cards (face cards have a value of 10, Ace has a value of 1) Variations to meet your child's needs: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Both players flip two cards instead of one to create a two-digit number. Players compare their two-digit numbers and the player with the higher number takes the cards. • Both players flip two cards and find the sum (add them). Players compare the sum of their cards and the player with the higher sum takes the cards. • Both players flip two cards and find the difference between their cards (subtract). Players then compare the difference between their cards and the player with the smallest difference wins the cards.

Homework Week of October 9 - 13	Reading	Read for 20 minutes every night.

	Keyboarding	Keyboarding will help your child communicate throughout his/her life. There are many typing games available.
	Math	Play a board game as a family such as Trouble, Scrabble, Monopoly, Cribbage, etc. Questions to consider when playing the game: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Does your child instantly recognize the dots on the die or do they count each one? 2. When playing with more than one die: Does your child count all the dots? Does your child recognize the value of one die and count on by 1's for the second die? Do they instantly recognize the dots on the dice and add them?
	Special Events	Traditions and Celebrations. At this time of year, there are many different celebrations such as the Diwali Festival of Lights, Yom Kippur (the Jewish holiday), Fall Harvest Festival (an Indigenous tradition), and Thanksgiving (a national holiday in Canada). Why is it important to respect other people's traditions and celebrations? Take time to research a celebration that you aren't familiar with and share what you find out with your family.

	Math	How many 4 digit odd numbers can you create using each of the digits 4, 5, 6, and 7 once only. How do you know when you found them all? Repeat task creating 4 digit even numbers using the same digits. Order the numbers from least to greatest. *Manipulative Tip: A number line is a great tool to help order numbers.
