My name is Carol Woodliffe. I am a parent of two children who attend Long Lake Public School. As you may know nine of the South End schools are under review by the Rainbow District School Board. Currently there are three options that have been presented to the public and within those options there is a possibility of Long Lake Public School closing due to under utilization. Parents, teachers and some community members have met to develop their own options to present to the Board and public at the next meeting scheduled for Tuesday, June 15 at 7 pm at Lockerby School.

One of our proposals would be to dedicate a portion of Long Lake School to be turned into a Recreational Education Centre. This centre would include a classroom, kitchen area, bathrooms and gymnasium. Long Lake Public School has acres of natural outdoor space accessible right from our back yard. The children at the school have use of partially groomed trails for hiking in the summer and skiing/snowshoeing in the winter. Our students also enjoy skating every week at the adjacent community rink. LLPS provides cross country skis and snow shoe equipment for each student in the school. This equipment could be lent out to interested parties. We also have use of a soccer and baseball field beside our property.

We have been granted access to Long Lake via the Sudbury Trail Plan snowmobile property. This potentially opens our proposed program to canoeing and kayaking. We would suggest that the Board support this proposal and provide an outdoor centre where all Rainbow District Schools could use for future field trips.

We would like to submit the following input into the accommodation review.

- 1. As a major consideration in the decision-making process, we would ask you to consider the needs of all students receiving special education programs and services. While this is most often achieved through inclusion, there is a need in each school for highly skilled and trained professionals who act in support capacities and provide leadership to educators. Generally speaking, classroom sizes, mixed-grades and support including SERTS and EA's which complement inclusive classrooms should be major considerations in the decision-making process based upon the needs of students requiring IPRCs and IEPs. While bigger isn't necessarily better; special education programs and services are a consideration in the dynamics around accommodation review for students with special needs.
- 2. If surplus space is identified at Lockerby (preferably because of the location of our office) or Lo-Ellen Secondary School; we would very much appreciate consideration of a classroom being identified as an Educator's Learning Centre of Excellence for students with learning disabilities, digital opportunities for digital learners. The purpose of this classroom would be to provide out-of-thebox, in the classroom, research-based technologies and toolboxes for educators to see, share and to experience differentiated instruction and universal design. This classroom could provide an opportunity for innovation, creativity, professional development and act as a catalyst for a model for any secondary school to implement Learning for All K-12. We would be pleased to explore this great partnership opportunity with you. It could be an LDAS/ Rainbow Schools project under the 'Learning City Initiative' currently being looked at by the City of Greater Sudbury Development Corporation. Like our brains . the opportunities would be boundless, limited only by our imagination i.e. retired teachers, post secondary education institutions, Northern Ontario Medical School, Canadian Mental Health Sudbury office, SRH Pediatric Centre of Excellence, Provincial Schools Branch, CEC

While we understand the complexity of the decision-making process in this accommodation review, we congratulate you for the engagement of the parents, students and community in the process. We entrust you with our kids for a significant portion of their childhood.
