7. Chairperson's Remarks

Lockerby Composite School was chosen among 1,000 schools <u>worldwide</u> to implement AP Capstone, an innovative Advanced Placement diploma program that allows students to develop skills for postsecondary success - research, collaboration and communication. The program consists of two courses taken in sequence, AP® Seminar (in Grade 11) and AP Research (in Grade 12), which were developed with direct feedback from postsecondary institutions. Lockerby Composite School will offer AP Seminar in the fall of 2017. Students who achieve standings in keeping with the program have an opportunity to earn an AP Seminar and Research Certificate™.

Rainbow District School Board hosted guest speaker Niigaan Sinclair for a presentation entitled "Truth and Reconciliation: We All Play a Role" on February 9 and 10, 2017. Prior to Mr. Sinclair, our own Trustee Grace Fox, residential school survivor, spoke with passion and inspiration. Niigaan Sinclair provided an opportunity to learn more about reconciliation and, more importantly, the role we can all play in this important process.

The International Dinner and Silent Auction in support of the Joan Mantle Music Trust will take place this year, on Saturday, April 8. Dr. Robert Hall has been selected as the 2017 recipient of the Joan Mantle Music Trust Community Award for his contribution to music and education. Dr. Robert "Bob" Hall is an

accomplished musician, vocalist, pianist, organist and conductor, who has served 22 years as Associate Professor of Music at Laurentian University, and Director of Music and Organist at St. Andrew's United Church, Sudbury. Dr. Hall's contributions to Sudbury's music culture have greatly influenced elementary, secondary and postsecondary education, as well as the community at large.

Students in Grades 7 to 12 will participate in the annual science fair on Tuesday, March 7, 2017 at Lockerby Composite School. The public is invited to view projects in the gym from 1:30 pm to 2:30 pm. The awards ceremony will take place in the auditorium from 1:45 pm to 2:15 pm. Up to 37 projects will be selected to advance to the Sudbury Regional Science Fair at Laurentian University on April 8 and 9, 2017.

Rainbow District School Board will host its twelfth annual Technological Skills Competition on Wednesday, March 8, 2017 at Cambrian College. Secondary students will test their skills in carpentry, welding, TV/video editing, photography, auto-service technology and cabinet making as they vie for the opportunity to compete in the provincial Skills Competition this May in Toronto.

Earlier this month, I attended the Student Senate meeting. It was an amazing experience. All of these students, under the leadership of Student Trustee Katie Yao, are inspiring. The group had committed to raising money for the Heart and Stroke Foundation by entering teams to "Ride the Big Bike" in May.
