8. **Director's Remarks**

The Director attended the Remembrance Day at the Sudbury Arena and spoke to community based events, more specifically Chelmsford Valley District Composite School. He also thanked the Trustees for ensuring there were funds to cover the costs of transportation to Remembrance Day events.

Friday November 22, 2019 is a Professional Development Day for employees. The theme is *Truth and Reconciliation - Commitment to Action*; featuring guest speakers Kevin Lameroux and Pam Toulouse for a half day and an in-school review of our *Commitment to Action* plan the other half day.

Director spoke about a recent success story at Cyril Varney Public School: A defibrillator was installed two weeks ago,

Cyril Varney PS staff were trained, via a video provided by Health & Safety, right after it was installed. On Monday morning of this week, during an assembly, the custodian collapsed. Four staff members leapt into action. Following the process, laid out by the defibrillator instructions, staff applied compression and paddle procedures.

Three times the defibrillator was utilized. During this quick action staff called 911. The ambulance arrived fairly quickly and paramedics took over. After ten minutes of interventions by the ambulatory care unit, the patient was brought to hospital. At this time staff did not know the outcome.

A volunteer fire person returned to the school to share the outcome. He indicated the patient was in serious condition but it was looking good. Then he said," if it were not for the quick action of staff she would not have made it." As you can imagine staff were overwhelmed.

In-house heroes include Sarah Flood, Jocelyn Police, Shannon Senior and Principal Kendra Mihell.

Director thanked David Digby, Rainbow's Health & Safety Officer, as well as superintendents Bourget and Bazinet for ensuring all sites within our Board have a defibrillator and most importantly, staff have been trained or are currently being trained.

Director thanked trustees for ensuring we had the dollars to facilitate this purchase through our Health & Safety budget.

Director advised the cost of a Defibrillator is approximately \$1600 per device.

7. Communications Report

Nicole Charette, Senior Advisor of Corporate Communications and Strategic Planning, delivered the following communications report:

Sudbury Secondary School has been recognized provincially for student success in mathematics, earning a 2018 Dr. Bette M. Stephenson Recognition of Achievement from the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO). Sudbury Secondary School's Grade 9 applied math scores increased by 25 percentage points while Grade 9 academic math results increased by 20 percentage points in the 2017-2018 school year.

Rainbow District School Board students captured top honours at the Mock Trial Competition on May 10, 2019. The Hennessy Cup was awarded to Lockerby Composite School. Silver medals were presented to students from Sudbury Secondary School.

Students garnered medals in coding, prepared speech, and horticulture and landscape at the Skills Ontario competition held May 6 to 8, 2019 in Mississauga. Skills Ontario is the largest event of its kind in Canada. Congratulations to Confederation Secondary School and Lo-Ellen Park Secondary School.

Kindergarten students from Northeastern Elementary School have teamed up with Cambrian College's Design and Visual Arts students to create a collaborative exhibit of visual work with a focus on what they could do to help the environment. The Tandem exhibit will be presented until May 16, 2019 from 11 am to 2 pm at the Open Studio in Room 2119 at Cambrian College.

A symbolic 12-hour walk took place on Manitoulin Island on May 11, 2019. Manitoulin Secondary School students, staff and members of the community walked an epic 60 kilometres to promote respect for water and care for earth.

Six young scientists from Rainbow Schools are representing our community at the Canada-Wide Science Fair in Fredericton, New Brunswick from May 11 to 17, 2019. They are among 500 young scientists showcasing their amazing works of discovery and innovation at the national level.

Brendon Matusch, a Grade 11 student from Lo-Ellen Park Secondary School, is representing Canada at the 2019 Intel International Science and Engineering Fair (Intel ISEF). Intel ISEF, the world championship of science fairs, is taking place from May 12 to 18, 2019 in Phoenix, Arizona.

The Confederation Secondary School cafeteria is now home to an Indigenous mural inspired by the Seven Grandfather Teachings. Students painted the mural under the direction of local Indigenous artist Michael Cywink. The Ontario Arts Council funded the project, which took approximately two weeks to complete.

The Lasalle Secondary School Black Box Theatre invites the community to "I Never Saw Another Butterfly." This powerful play will be presented at the school from May 29 to June 1, 2019 at 7:30 pm. There will also be a matinée on Saturday, June 1, 2019 at 2 pm. Between 1933 and 1945, more than 11 million people were exterminated during the Holocaust, six million of whom were Jewish. Of those six million, 1.5 million were children. More than 15,000 Jewish children under the age of 16 passed through the Terezen Concentration Camp. Fewer than 150 survived. "I Never Saw Another Butterfly" follows Raja, a child survivor of Terezin, and Raja's teacher, Irena Synkova, who helped prepare Raja for this feat.

She also focused on the Grade 7 and 8 Math Challenge, Coding unit, Ontario Skills Competition, a rummage sale to raise funds for athletics, and a community clean up with Walden Public School.

Bernadette Rémillard highlighted a number of activities at Lansdowne Public School, including track and field, Education Week, Music Monday, book swap, teacher appreciation, Math Games Family Night, annual clean up, Wellness Day that featured many workshops, traditional gathering to honour water and the Grade 8 graduation.

She also highlighted activities at Sudbury Secondary School, including a new weight room, Pink Day, school play, singers at the Joan Mantle Music Trust International Dinner, Bands, Exposed art showcase, renowned chorographer in the dance class, new computers for media arts, climate change project, flag for Alex Trebek, EQAO, Mock Trial Competition, Special Olympics and John Street community garden clean up.

Shelley Depaolis of Lasalle Secondary School talked about the construction projects at the school, including the new multi-use sports complex and new French Immersion JK to Grade 6 school and the renovations to welcome area Grade 7 and 8 students. The school is offering students Advanced Placement Program options in specific subjects.

Kim Nadeau of Public Health shared information about a pilot program at Lockerby Composite School and focused on harm reduction messages, including make it the right kind of memorable and plan ahead to reduce risk.

Angelina Kasunich of Lockerby Composite School shared information about financial literacy programs that may be of interest to schools, including budget boot camp, value for money, growing up in a cashless world, saving for the future, funding post-secondary education, credit, and the digital world and fraud. Financial literacy is part of Civics and Careers in Grade 10.
