2. 2020-2021 School Year Update

Director Blaseg provided a detailed update on the 2020-2021 school year, including a chronology of numerous events since the March Board meeting. Amendments

A total of 174 (Full Time Equivalent) special education teachers have been allocated for 2021-2022. This includes 81 Resource Teachers, 70 Intensive Support Program Teachers (this includes Section 23 teachers), and 12 Itinerant Teachers. This number represents an increase of 11 teachers from 2020-2021.

The number of (Full Time Equivalent) Educational Assistants is 191. This number represents Educational Assistants in Section 23 Programs. The number of Communicative Disorder Assistants remains at 6.

These allocations include section 23 teachers and educational assistants.

A BY-LAW authorizing the Rainbow District School Board (the "Board") to borrow money pursuant to the provisions of section 247 of the Education Act (the "Act") for the raising of funds to finance certain permanent improvements as more particularly described in this By-Law.

WHEREAS:

- A. The Board has authorized the permanent improvements under the: School Condition Improvement Funding Program \$13,330,867
- B. The Board wishes to apply to the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce ("CIBC") for a short term capital loan through the purchase of Bankers Acceptance for the purpose of financing the permanent improvements;
- C. The total cost of the projects is within the Board's Debt and Financial Obligation Limit as established by the Ministry of Education.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. The Treasurer and the Deputy Treasurer of the Board are authorized on behalf of the Board to borrow \$13,330,867 for permanent improvements in accordance with the Act, plus interest at a rate to be agreed upon from time to time with the CIBC and consistent with the short term borrowing direction provided by the Ministry of Education.
- 2. The Treasurer and the Deputy Treasurer are authorized for and on behalf of the Board to execute and deliver all such other documents and to do such other acts and things as may be necessary to give full effect to this By-Law.

Superintendent Wachnuk shared that 22 students are currently in-person learning at Jean Hanson School, A.B.Ellis Public School and the Ruth MacMillan Centre. Individual Student Profiles are reviewed as needed and when movement is possible.

Vaccination is available for select staff who work closely with students in Intensive Support Placements.

Five of our staff members have and/or continue to receive training from the Geneva Centre for Autism.

The Ministry of Education is investing money into Summer Programming to assist with gap closing. Offerings, details, and feasibly are currently being discussed. An update will be provided at the May SEAC meeting.

Superintendent Wachnuk reminded members that the Special Education Budget and the Special Education Staffing Allocation will be discussed at the SEAC meeting in May. Manager of Finance, Nancy Cecchetto, will also be in attendance.

11.0 Special Education Staff Report

Principal McDonald provided highlights of the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services' (MCCSS) plan to provide an Entry To School Program for preschool children (aged 3-5 years) who have a diagnosis of Autism and who are registered in the Ontario Autism Program. This multi-disciplinary project will include involvement from various community partners, numerous service providers, and the school boards.

Preschool Transition meetings are wrapping up and Spring IPRCs are being planned virtually.

Dear Premier Ford and Minister Lecce:

On behalf of Rainbow District School Board, I would like to thank you for including education workers in Phase Two of the Province's COVID-19 vaccine distribution plan. However, with the prevalence of variants of concern locally and provincially, vaccination is essential to limiting the spread of COVID-19, keeping everyone safe and returning to pre-pandemic life.

To date, our education staff who work with students with special needs and those who teach in high-risk congregate settings have been offered an opportunity to be vaccinated. We are grateful to Public Health Sudbury & Districts for working with us to make this happen.

These employee groups, however, represent a small fraction of our total workforce, which prompted Trustees to pass the following motion at the Board meeting held on April 20, 2021:

"That Rainbow District School Board write a letter to Premier Ford and the Minister of Education, with copies to Public Health Sudbury & Districts, Federations, OPSBA Member Boards, Minister of Health, and opposition parties, requesting all education sector workers receive a covid vaccine on a priority basis."

In a memo to school boards dated March 5, 2021, Minister Lecce indicated that Phase Two is expected to be completed by the end of July. This time-frame will not give our education workers the protection they require for the start of the 2021-2022 school year.

Therefore, we respectfully request that education workers receive their first and second doses of vaccine by mid-August 2021, even if the intervals between doses need to be shortened.

Given that school board staff work in congregate settings, they require the greatest protection possible. Vaccinations, along with the many health and safety measures that have been implemented to date, will ensure that students and staff can resume in-person learning with more confidence and fewer interruptions.

Education workers have been on the frontline of this pandemic for more than a year, keeping students safe and supported. We must make their health, safety and well-being a priority for the benefit of students and families.

We believe that the return to normalcy in this province is dependent on the return to normalcy in the education of our children.
