RE: ONE CONFIRMED CASE OF COVID-19 AT LOCKERBY COMPOSITE SCHOOL

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Public Health Sudbury & Districts has advised Rainbow District School Board that a confirmed case of COVID-19 has been reported at Lockerby Composite School.

The individual is currently self-isolating and being monitored by Public Health Sudbury & Districts. The school will be cleaned and disinfected this weekend. There is no evidence of transmission at the school at this time.

Lockerby Composite School remains open for in-person learning.

The school will follow up with affected students to ensure continuity of learning.

By direction of Public Health, the requirement for staff and students in the following classes to be tested and to self-isolate up to and including November 5, 2021 is based on the individual's immunization status - Transportation Technology: Small Engine and Recreational Equipment (TTS3C0-03) and Computer Programming (ICS4U0-01).

The affected students, their parents/guardians and relevant staff have been notified and have received a letter from Public Health with specific guidance.

By direction of Public Health, students on the morning secondary Route L374 and the morning transfer Route L357 as well as students on the afternoon secondary Route L354 have been asked to self-isolate to and including November 5, 2021 – based on immunization status. The affected students, their parents/guardians and relevant bus drivers have been notified and have received a letter from Public Health with specific guidance. **These bus routes are cancelled and will resume on Monday, November 8, 2021.**

For students and staff who have not been asked to self-isolate as part of this confirmed case, the following applies:

- Simply passing by an infected person in the hallway is not considered close contact, and the risk of spreading the virus this way is extremely low.
- Remember to screen for COVID-19 daily. Continue to use the **COVID-19 Screening Tool for Children in School and Child Care** <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/> to monitor for symptoms and follow the direction provided. **Anyone who is sick must stay home.**

Remember to follow the critical ongoing COVID-19 prevention measures:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Sneeze and cough into your sleeve.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Stay home and [isolate](#) if symptoms appear.
- Practise two-metre physical distancing.
- **Wear a mask** at all times in indoor public spaces.

When outdoors, students are encouraged to maintain physical distancing.

We continue to work closely with Public Health as we implement ongoing health and safety protocols to limit the spread of COVID-19.

We will monitor our school population closely for any signs of COVID-19 and follow the guidance from Public Health.

Public Health continues to investigate the situation and if any risks to the school community are identified, they may direct additional measures.
