GOVERNANCE BY-LAWS

14. **Governance By-Law 14: Electronic Meetings**

- 14.1 The Board may provide for the use of electronic means for the holding of meetings of the Board and/or meetings of committees of the Board, including in-Camera meetings.
- 14.2.1 At every electronic meeting of the Board and/or meetings of committees of the Board, the following persons must be physically present in the meeting room:
 - a) the Chair of the Board and/or designate and/or the chair of committees of the Board and/or designate;
 - b) at least one additional member of the Board and/or committees of the Board; and
 - c) the Director of Education or designate.
- 14.2.2 The Chair of the Board or of a committee of the Board or his or her designate may participate in a meeting of the Board or of a committee of the Board by electronic means
 - a) The distance from the Chair's or designate's current residence to the meeting location is 200 kilometers or more;
 - b) weather conditions do not allow the Chair or designate to travel to the meeting location safely; or
 - c) the Chair or designate cannot be physically present at a meeting due to healthrelated issues.
- 14.2.3 It shall provide that the Chair or designate must be physically present for at least half of the meetings of the Board for any 12 month period beginning November 15th.
- 14.3 At the request of any Board member or student representative, the Board may provide the member or representative with electronic means of participating in one or more meetings of the Board and/or of a committee of the Board, including in-camera meetings, except where to do so would not comply with section 14.2.
- 14.3.1 The electronic means shall permit the Board member or student representative to hear and be heard by all other participants in the meeting.
- 14.4 A member of the Board or student representative of the Board who participates in a meeting through electronic means shall be deemed to be present at the meeting.
- 14.5 The rules governing conflict of interest of members shall apply to electronic meetings.

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GOVERNANCE BY-LAWS

- 14.6 The Board may provide, at one or more locations within its jurisdiction, electronic means to permit participating in meetings by members of the public excluding in-camera meetings.
- 14.7 For the purpose of complete disclosure, at every electronic meeting of the Board, members participating through electronic means shall be made aware of the Board members physically present in the room, the Board members participating electronically and whether or not the public and/or media are present.

Board members who participate in *in-camera* meetings by electronic means, must participate from a room which is closed to any other person so that no other person can hear that member or other members of the Board. Speaker phones, cell phones or portable phones may not be used. Board members must maintain rules of confidentiality and are subject to Board Policy No. GOV-05 Code of Conduct: Board Members.

1. Welcome

Superintendent Lesley Fisher welcomed everyone to the meeting.

2. Self-Introductions

Those in attendance introduced themselves.

3. De-streaming Grade 9

Presenter: Maureen McNamara, Principal of Student Success

Maureen McNamara provided an overview of de-streaming the Grade 9 curriculum which was fully implemented in September 2022. Over time, course and graduation data showed that students in the applied pathway were not succeeding to the same degree as students in the academic pathway. Research concluded that the public education system in Ontario needed to understand and engage all learners as soon as they enter high school, not channel them into different streams based on perceived levels of ability, which limits further studies and career options.

De-streaming Grade 9 respects diversity, promotes inclusive education, and works towards identifying and eliminating barriers in education that may limit the ability of all students to achieve their full potential. Grade 9 students take de-streamed English, Geography and French; de-streamed Math (which began in 2021-2022) and Science;

Open Physical Education; and two elective courses, with course options that vary by school.

According to research, education systems that maintain a cohort containing students of all abilities in Grade 9 tend to produce higher levels of student achievement across the whole student population. All students benefit when they learn together with students of varying abilities and interests. Ontario is the last province in Canada to implement de-streaming.

4. Discussion based on presentation

PIC members were invited to ask questions during and following the presentation. A parent asked if we had any data on the success of the de-streamed Grade 9 math course which was implemented in September 2021. The board has EQAO data for Semester 2 which shows that students achieved the highest success rate among Northern school boards. However, it is too soon to determine any trends. The 2022-2023 school year will provide baseline data with results for both Semester 1 and Semester 2.

Another parent expressed concerns about de-streaming on behalf of her School Council. More advanced students will not be challenged enough by course content that is tailored to all levels of ability. Superintendent Fisher and Principal McNamara said Rainbow Schools are implementing The Thinking Classroom model by Dr. Peter Liljedahl which focuses on collaborative problem-solving, critical thinking, and communication. Parents who have any concerns should follow up directly with teachers. They also indicated that the board is now offering a Bridge Math course for students who require more support with math.

The Foods Class joined a local bake shop in making gingerbread cookies for the school's festive feast on December 15, 2022. There was also a bake sale to raise money for a field trip for the arts classes. Students collected warm clothing for individuals who are homeless. Little Skidoo was presented in the Sheridan Auditorium. Dance students performed on the CTV Lions Club Telethon. The swim team competed at a local meet. I'm Glad It's Christmas, a Hallmark movie made in Sudbury, includes scenes filmed at Sudbury Secondary School.

Melissa Gladu of Northeastern Elementary School said there are a lot of great things happening, including sports and feasts. She said it's great to see the energy with the return of in-person activities. New administrators have introduced new events. Thirty families went out into the community for one hour to canvass for the food drive, which was very successful. Parents will be serving during the Christmas Feast on December 14, 2022. She praised the school for maintaining long-held practices and introducing new traditions.

Colleen Burns of Lansdowne Public School says it feels like the school is getting back to normal. Students have been excited to participate in field trips. The Dare to Care program is being implemented in the primary and junior divisions. The intermediate program will be launched in January 2023. Students who are caught being kind are recognized. Students continue to participate in EcoSchools with a compost program, garden maintained by Sudbury Shared Harvest in the summer, and a Good On One Side (GOOS) initiative. She said the school is most appreciative of the community's support of its families and students through the Adopt-a-Family program, the donation of turkeys, and a giving tree. She thanked all partners. She added that Lansdowne contributed over 2,700 cans to the Edgar Burton Food Drive.

Angelina Kasunich of Lockerby Composite School said there are many activities to celebrate. Parents are well informed through a weekly newsletter. The biggest achievement this fall was the return of door-to-door canvassing for the cancer drive

which raised an amazing \$27,000. She thanked all donors for their tremendous support. She also highlighted the holiday concert, curling team, food drive, sports, an upcoming masquerade party, and a successful Open House. She added that students are thinking about careers and applying to post-secondary programs.

Shannon Ketchabaw of A.B. Ellis Public School said the school participated in the Stuff the Bus Food Drive for the Espanola Food Bank in partnership with Veterans Bus Lines. The school held another successful Krispy Kreme fundraiser. Money was also raised to buy toys for local children with matching funds from the local Lions Club. She also highlighted sports, festive events, the school's Platinum EcoSchools certification, and its continued participation in the Terry Fox Run, raising \$6,307.50 this year.

Parents enquired about the Parents Reaching Out Grant applications. Superintendent Fisher indicated that applications will be reviewed at the January PIC meeting. Rainbow District School Board received \$24,000 to share amongst its schools. Maximum amount per project is \$2,000. A total of 12 applications were received by December 13, 2022.

Six SEAC members responded to the survey regarding future meetings - 66% voted in favour of keeping future meetings virtual and 100% voted in favour of waiting to resume SEAC until February 2023.

8.0 New Business

Special Education Summer Programs 2022 Presentation

Principal of Special Education Colleen McDonald and Manager of the Applied Behaviour Analysis Team Brien Managhan provided a presentation about the Special Education Summer Programs offered by RDSB in the summer of 2022. There was a wide range of programming offered during the summer, including three special education programs, mental health supports, kindergarten camp, elementary K-8 program, secondary 9-12 program and a program for newcomers to Canada. The Special Education programs provided included a K-12 summer transition program for students with special needs and/or students experiencing anxiety and a skill development program for students with Autism. The Special Education Summer Programs were well received and families are already inquiring about the availability of programs for summer 2023. In addition to programs, Special Education assessments were also completed over the summer. Stephanie Frenette, RDSB Speech-Language Pathologist, conducted 26 Speech/Language Assessments and Dr. Patricia Ross, Clinical Psychologist, completed 10 Psycho-Educational Assessments.

9.0 Requests for Leaves of Absence

There were no requests for leaves of absence from the October 5, 2022 SEAC meeting.

10.0 Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Wachnuk discussed several upcoming conferences that RDSB Special Education staff will be attending, including the October 27 Inclusion Symposium through OSSTF, the virtual OCASE Symposium for Board and School Special Education Staff in November and the CEC Conference on wellbeing, equity and success for all happening in December.

Superintendent Wachnuk reviewed the upcoming October 24th PA Day. Half of the day will be school improvement planning and the other half day will include virtual learning carousels that are specific to staff in their roles at RDSB.

Superintendent Wachnuk also discussed the return of OLSAT testing, as it has not been done since the start of the COVID pandemic. This test helps to

determine a baseline achievement for RDSB students in grades 4 and 7. OLSAT data will be compared to EQAO scores to ensure achievement is in line.

Superintendent Wachnuk also discussed the resumption of SIP Applications. Since the start of the COVID pandemic, the Ministry of Education has been providing funding based on pre-pandemic student need numbers. SIP funding is used to support students with the most significant need in our schools. Typically this funding helps to pay for Educational Assistants across the board.

Superintendent Wachnuk shared that Laurie-Ann Lielkalns has been hired as the new Vice Principal of Special Education Programs & Services. This is a new position funded through the Ministry of Education. Vice Principal Lielkalns' main role is to oversee all of the Section Programs, including those with HSN, Compass, CTC and Youth Justice. Vice Principal Lielkalns comes to this role with a wealth of Special Education experience as she was previously a Special Education Coordinator with the board. She is currently working hard to finalize Memorandums of Understanding with our community partners.

11.0 Special Education Staff Report

Principal McDonald discussed the upcoming PA Day on October 24, 2022 that will focus on Culturally Responsive Relevant Pedagogy (CRRP). Special Education staff will be offering five or six sessions to teachers covering topics that include social skills, assistive technology, sound walls, Project Search and ways to support Special Education needs in the French Immersion classroom. Educational Assistants will be receiving a full-day of First Aid training on the October PA Day.

Principal McDonald also shared that RDSB Program Staff are working with post-secondary institutions and elementary schools to coordinate possible tutoring opportunities. Tutors will be receiving training from RDSB Program Staff over the next week and then will begin working with students.

Principal McDonald also shared information about a new Special Education job posting for a full-time Transitions Facilitator. This individual will need to work with parents, teachers, students, key staff and community partners to support students with Special Education needs through various transitions.

12.0 Board Report

Trustee Kosmerly shared that the most recent Board Meeting reviewed the summer program offerings.

Trustee Kosmerly also shared that this is census week. RDSB students are completing the government census so we are aware of their needs as learners.

13.0 Chairperson's Remarks

W. Larouche reminded SEAC members that our next meeting will not take place until after the election is finalized. The new SEAC Committee will be meeting next on February 1, 2023.

Natasha Delaney: Autism Ontario – Sudbury Chapter

The October Newsletter from Autism Ontario will be shared with SEAC members via email. Autism Ontario is now providing online parent support groups to help parents connect to better support children with Autism.

Robert Silvestri: NOARC

NOARC is experiencing an increase in the number of assessments. They are also noticing a rise in mental health struggles in their current cohort of students.

Wendy Larouche: Learning Disabilities Association of Sudbury

The Learning Disabilities Association of Sudbury's flag was raised this week at James Jerome Sports Complex to officially mark October as Learning Disabilities Awareness Month in Greater Sudbury. Following the ceremony, 2080 small blue flags representing the total number of students who have been identified with a Learning Disability within our school system were planted along Paris Street.
