C. PRESENTATIONS

1. Science Fair

Superintendent Lesley Fisher introduced Catherine Norrie, Elementary Science Fair Chair, who spoke about this year's events. At the board-wide event held in March, there were 47 high caliber projects on display with 28 of them moving on to the Sudbury Regional Science Fair held at Laurentian University's Alumni Hall on April 1 and 2, 2023.

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From the regional fair, 2 Rainbow elementary projects and 1 Rainbow secondary project were selected for the Canada-Wide Science Fair in Edmonton from May 17 to 19, 2023.

Principal Pamela Potvin and Hailey Marshall, Lo Ellen Park Intermediate Science/STEM teacher, introduced the winners that will be attending the National Science Fair.

Lo Ellen Park Intermediate students, Ben Kawa, Arthur Queiroz and Thomas Mullaly gave brief overviews of their projects. Ben's project titled "Driver Wake Up" is a device using artificial intelligence that detects when drivers have fallen asleep behind the wheel. Arthur and Thomas spoke about their project "Can Worms be a Part of the Styrofoam Pollution Solution", which involved a 16 day study to see which type of worm consumed the most Styrofoam, to ultimately assist in the reduction of Styrofoam in landfills.

Aaryan Harshith, a grade 12 Lo Ellen Park student, shared his project "Light IR: An Intraoperative Probe to Enhance Tumor Resection", which is a handheld device that allows surgeons to differentiate between cancerous and healthy tissues in tumor removal surgeries.

Trustees and guests were given the opportunity to browse the projects and ask questions of the presenters.

Trustees wished the students well in Edmonton.

2. Math Intervention Tool

Superintendent Fisher welcomed Principal of Program Dan Koziar, Danielle Gagnon, Elementary Math Consultant, and Katrina Nadeau, Vice-Principal of Redwood Acres and former system math coach to speak about the MathUP program and the impact that it is having throughout the system and particularly at Redwood Acres Public School.

MathUp is a fully realized instructional resource, that addresses the entirety of the mathematics curriculum and scope of teacher practices. Developed by Dr. Marian Small, it supports student learning, but also provides opportunities and tools that support teacher professional learning and parent communication. MathUP includes tools and resources to support teachers in planning their year of math learning, planning for each math topic, and planning each specific lesson.

Trustees were given the opportunity to ask questions.

3. <u>School Year Update</u>

Director Bourget provided an overview of new legislation introduced by the Minister of Education on April 17, 2023.

The Minister of Education announced that the Better Schools and Student Outcomes Act, if passed, is focused on improving student outcomes in important life-long skills like reading, writing and math.

Director Bourget shared RDSB initiatives within our six priority areas of our Strategic Directions.

Trustees were given the opportunity to ask questions.

9.0 New Business

Special Education Coordinators Carole Burke and Leslie Hamill provided a presentation on the alternative and provincial report cards. The Alternative Report Card is used to report on student's progress who are working on Alternative learning expectations, such as Communication or Life Skills, expectations which are not part of the Ontario Curriculum. A sample IEP with Alternative learning expectations and sample Alternative Report Card was

with Alternative learning expectations and sample Alternative Report Card was shared.

The Provincial Report Card is used to report on student's progress who are working on Ontario Curriculum Expectations. This includes students who have an accommodated or modified IEP. Sample elementary and secondary provincial report cards were shared.

Students working towards achieving both Ontario Curriculum and Alternative Curriculum expectations will receive a Provincial report card and an Alternative Report Card.

J. Contini requested that a copy of the alternative and provincial report card presentation be shared with SEAC members.

11.0 Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Wachnuk shared that staffing is underway for the 2023-2024 school year. She will be sharing a detailed staffing plan with SEAC at our May meeting, at which time SEAC members will be invited to vote on the approval of the plan. Superintendent Wachnuk expects the need to open additional Intensive Support Program classrooms for the upcoming school year because of the increase in incoming needs at the Kindergarten level. We continue to work with community agencies to run preschool transition meetings for incoming students

with high needs. At the same time, the Rainbow District School Board continues to work towards the Inclusion Model in Special Education.

Superintendent Wachnuk shared that after three days of negotiations a tentative deal has been reached with Educational Assistants. She will share more information once the deal has been ratified.

Superintendent Wachnuk provided information related to Project Search HSN. One of the Project Search HSN Interns has now been hired as an employee in the food services department at HSN.

Superintendent Wachnuk has scheduled a meeting with the Ontario Autism Program at the end of April 2023. The purpose of the meeting will be to ensure we are doing everything with OAP to maximize services for our students with Autism and their families.

Superintendent Wachnuk provided information regarding the upcoming PA Day on April 28, 2023. The PA Day will include presentations from several guest speakers as well as shorter, more specialized professional development sessions.

12.0 Special Education Staff Report

Principal McDonald shared that Board Special Education staff continue to work through preschool transition meetings to prepare incoming students for their transition to Kindergarten in September 2023. We will be hosting over 100 preschool transition meetings for incoming students this year.

Principal McDonald shared that Grade 8 to 9 spring IPRCs will begin soon. Board Special Education staff continue to support the transition of students with IEPs starting secondary school in September 2023.

Principal McDonald provided information for the upcoming April 28 PA Day. Board Special Education staff will be providing workshops in the areas of speech and language, IEP development and technology training.

Principal McDonald included a Project Search HSN update. One of the interns recently started a part-time job in the community and another intern has been hired permanently as an employee at HSN. March of Dimes continues to support Project Search interns in the program and in the community.

13.0 Board Report

Trustee Kosmerly shared that trustees are currently reviewing the board by-laws.

Trustee Kosmerley also shared information from the March 21st Board Meeting. Trustees voted to write a letter to the Premier, and to the Ministers of Education, Health and Children, and Community and Social Services to advocate for the implementation of the recommendations made by the Ontario Coalition for Children and Youth Mental Health.

Aside from the Board Report, Trustee Kosmerly also shared that the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) is offering an Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) at their office on April 17 and 18. Anyone interested in the training can contact CMHA Sudbury-Manitoulin directly for more information.

14.0 Chairperson's Remarks

W. Larouche shared that Member of Parliament Heather McPherson tabled a bill in the House of Commons seeking national standards for supporting people with ADHD. The goal is to provide awareness training for medical and education staff, equitable access to medical and mental health professionals, and resource creation for ways to manage, recognize and understand the disorder. ADHD is not currently recognized as a category of exceptionality with the Ministry of Education but is recognized at post-secondary educational institutions.
