Chair Farrow, Trustees:

I hope that you have all had a wonderful summer.

I look forward to working with you, Superintendents, administrators, staff, students, families, First Nations Chiefs and communities and all of our partners as we continue our journey together.

To begin, I would like to extend a warm welcome to Daynara Cyr and Izabella Guenette and tell you a bit more about our Student Trustees.

From Zhiibaahaasing First Nation, Daynara Cyr is the former Indigenous Student Senator for Sudbury Secondary School and this year's Indigenous Student Senator for Manitoulin Secondary School. She is passionate about Indigenous Advocacy, and sharing her language and culture.

Daynara attended Grade 9 and 10 at Sudbury Secondary School where she was enrolled in the Specialist High Skills Major in Visual Arts and Dance. She worked with a team of peers to establish the Sudbury Secondary School Indigenous Advocacy Committee. Daynara has facilitated ribbon skirt making classes, presented hand-drumming practices, shared cultural teachings, and offered fancy shawl demonstrations at school-wide and public events.

As she enters Grade 11, she will continue to be a student leader at Manitoulin Secondary School where she plans to get involved in school sports. Daynara is taking the level 3 Ojibwe course and would like to teach Anishinaabemowin in her community to revitalize the language. She also wants to continue making regalia, ribbon skirts, shirts, vests, and building her brand as

an Anishinaabe seamstress, aspiring to have her creations featured on runways. Daynara contributes to Youth Councils on Manitoulin Island.

“Through school involvement, students learn important life skills like collaboration, communication and leadership,” she says. “Being involved has enabled me to meet new people and gain an appreciation for the diversity in our schools.” Daynara says student voice matters because students are the future. “I am so excited to be representing Indigenous students across the Rainbow District and be a role model and a voice for us all,” she says.

A Grade 12 student at Lasalle Secondary School, Izabella Guenette is actively involved in her school community, including drama productions, the Concert Band, Jazz Band, Senior Winds, and many sports from flag football and basketball to volleyball and soccer.

Izabella is President of Student Council and serves as score keeper and captain of the Reach for the Top Team. She has also supported Lasalle’s Sport Health Academics and Leadership Program (SHAL), helping out with tournaments and special events. Her involvement in school life will continue as she co-chairs the Student Senate and serves as Student Trustee.

“Involvement in school and school life is extremely important as you get to experience new things and meet new people, which can lead to lifelong relationships,” says Izabella. “You also get to develop your strengths, such as leadership, confidence, responsibility and time management.”

She adds: “Students experience school every day. Their voice matters. When students have the opportunity to be heard, they are recognized as active participants in their education. They feel respected and know they matter.”

Izabella says every student experiences the school day differently, through extracurriculars, academics and social aspects. “The student perspective offers valuable insight,” she says. “The student voice makes education more meaningful.”

We know Student Trustee Izabella Guenette and Student Trustee Daynara Cyr will be strong voices for their peers.

9.0 Special Education Budget

Nancy Cecchetto, Manager of Finance, shared the proposed special education budget for 2025-2026. Funding for school boards next year has not yet been

announced by the Ministry of Education. The budget for 2024-2025 and funding received this past year from the Special Education Grant was used to prepare the proposed budget for next year.

Funding received through the Special Education Grant is dedicated only to special education programs and services. Some flexibility for school boards is permitted allowing unspent funds allocated for Applied Behaviour Analysis training or Special Equipment Amount purchases to be used in other areas of special education. The Ministry made changes to Special Incidence Portion funding from an application to a formula-based model. Responsive Education Programs (REP) funding is provided by the Ministry to support specific, targeted initiatives focused on student learning and well-being. It supplements core education funding and is intended to address emerging needs and pilot new programs. It is reviewed annually.

The Board saw an increase in overall student enrolment during the past year. An additional 24 students attend an Intensive Support Program compared to the previous year. Approximately 97 percent of expenditures relates to staffing. A balanced budget is being proposed to the Board. Funds drawn from special education reserves have been incorporated into the proposed budget.
